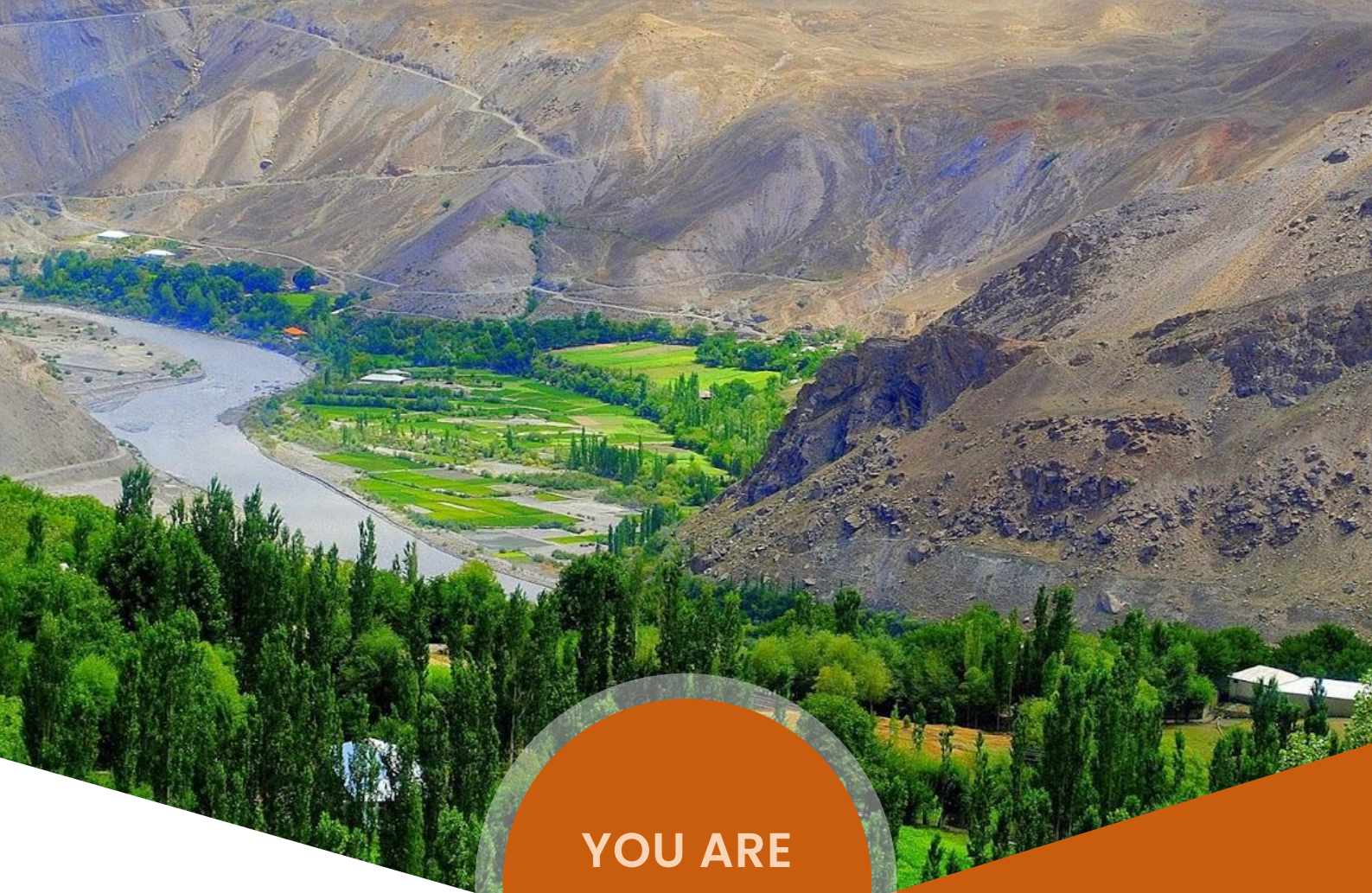

The capital of the northern Pakistani province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is Peshawar. The city is located close to the Khyber Pass, west of the Bara River, a tributary of the Kabul River. Peshawar is the largest city of Khyber Pukhtunkhwa and fifth largest city in Pakistan after Karachi, Lahore, Faisalabad and Rawalpindi. The administrative and economic centre of Pakistan's Federally Administered Tribal Areas is Peshawar, a large metropolis. Peshawar is located in a sizable valley close to the border between Pakistan and Afghanistan, at the eastern end of the Khyber Pass. Known as the "City on the Frontier," Peshawar is one of the most dynamic and culturally rich towns in the area.

- Overnight stay in Hotel.



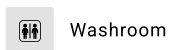
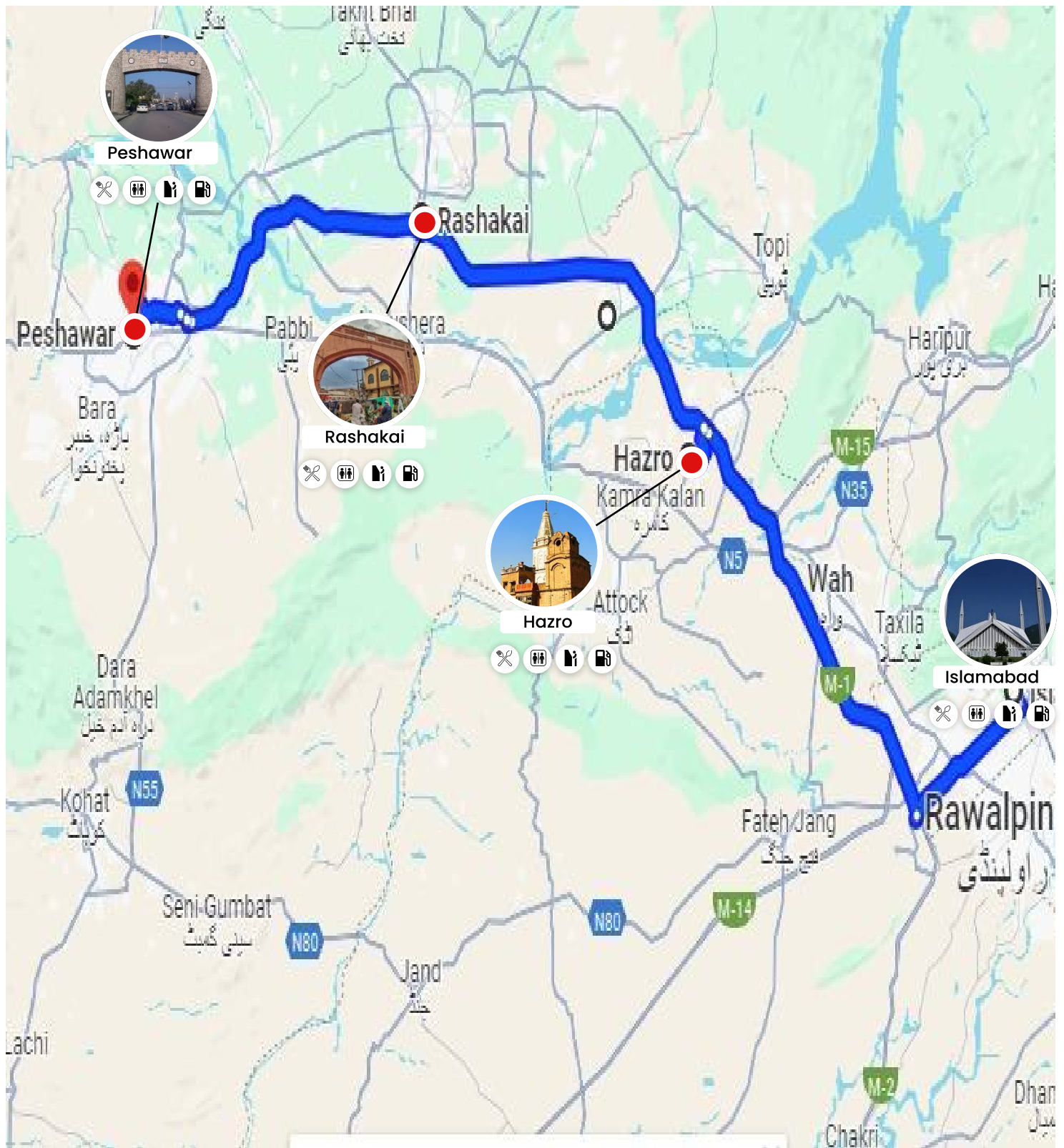
Day 3

PLACES TO VISIT

Peshawar Museum:

This museum houses one of the finest collections of Gandharan Art globally, showcasing artworks from the 1st to 5th centuries AD. Originally constructed by the British, The museum's well-organized sections present remarkable exhibitions, depictions of his life, Bodhisattvas, and classical scenes, making it a marvel to behold. If you are visiting Peshawar then visit Peshawar museum first.



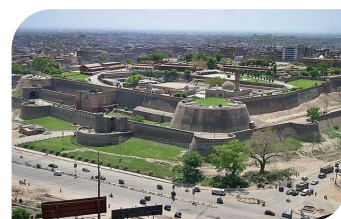
Mahabat Khan Mosque

Muhabat Khan Mosque, an ancient heritage of Peshawar, sits at the city's heart and approachable form congested surrounded Bazars. Constructed by the former governor Muhabat Khan, it stands as a testament to the city's history. The mosque has a large courtyard and a ablution pool in the middle, it has two big minarets & two small ones. Visit this beautiful mosque while visiting Peshawar.



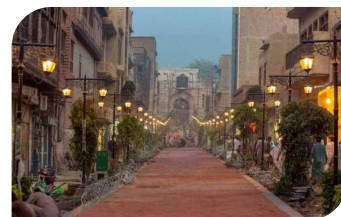
Bala Hisar Fort:

Located in the heart of Peshawar city, The Fort Bala Hisar is a historical fort constructed by the Mughals. Serving as a protective stronghold for the walled city of Peshawar against Sikh invasions, Well preserved area of its old times of the old city of Peshawar. This building is beautiful example of mix architecture as it is combination of Sikh Muslim and mughal architecture. Must visit this place if you are visiting Peshawar.



Qissa Khawani Bazaar:

The oldest market in the provincial capital. Qissa Khwani, originating from Persian words Qissa Khwan meaning "storytellers," was historically known for its cafes where storytellers entertained travelers and traders from around the world. Two monuments in the street's center commemorate the massacre of April 23, 1930, when British forces killed approximately 400 demonstrators during the independence movement.



Seethi Street:

Sethi Mohallah, situated in Peshawar's old city, is a traditional neighborhood boasting seven South Asian mansions constructed by the renowned Sethi family, prominent traders of Peshawar. These late 19th-century houses feature Central Asian-inspired architecture with intricate wooden carvings. Nestled within a narrow alley in the old city, these ancient mansions epitomize Mughal architecture in its purest form.



Khyber Pass:

Khyber pass attraction is the main symbol of Pakhton Khwab Region (Sarhad). What a beautiful and historical pass so much history behind these bricks wonderful read a bit about the pass before seeing to better appreciate. It takes 1.5 hrs from Peshawar to Khyber pass and it is very close to Kharkhano market therefore very accessible. There is also a railway line that passes through Khyber Pass, known as the Khyber Pass Railway.



Islamia College Peshawar:

Islamia College Peshawar is one of the most prestigious educational institutions in Pakistan, with a rich history and significant contributions to the region's educational landscape. Here's an overview of this esteemed institution.



Heritage Trail Peshawar:

The heritage trail starts at the historical Ghanta Ghar, passes through Bazaar-e-Kalan and Sethian Mohallah with its 1882 wooden havelis, and ends at the Gor Gathri archaeological complex, once the residence of Italian mercenary general Paolo Avitabile during Sikh rule. The rich archaeological and cultural sites make it an ideal spot for a heritage trail, attracting more tourists.



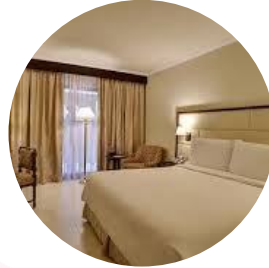
Chowk Yaadgar :

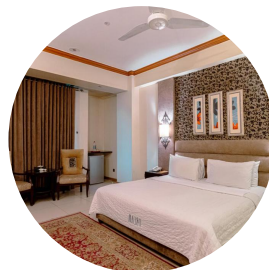
Peshawar Barracks by Shelton's Rezidor:

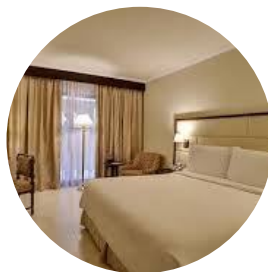
Shelton Rezidor:

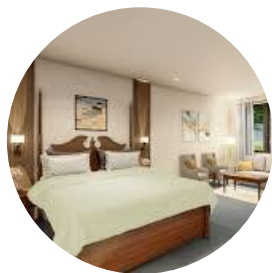
Fort Continental Hotel Peshawar:
